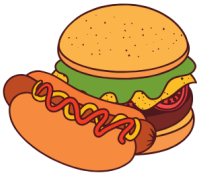

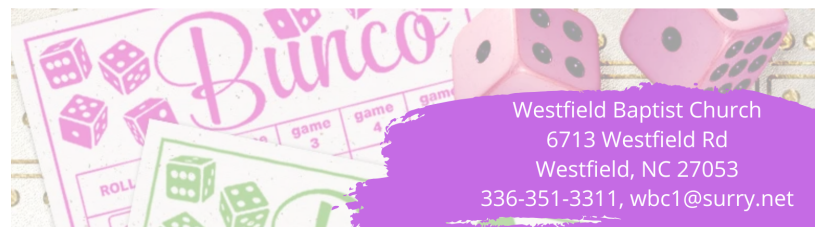

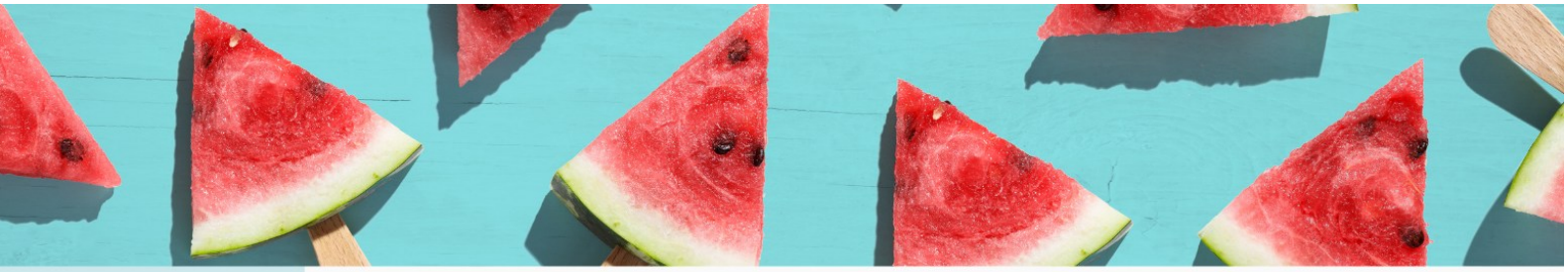

Dear Westfield Family,

On Sunday, July 27, 2025, WBC will host a "Friends Day."

Perhaps you've taken part in a Friends Day before, and even if not, you're probably familiar with the concept. It's an invite-your-friend-to-church day.

Sometimes churches will have door prizes. Who brought the most friends? Who has been friends the longest? You get the idea.

Sometimes churches will share a fellowship meal afterwards, too.

We'll probably borrow from some of these ideas when we host our own Friends Day. But that isn't all that we'll do. We are planning and praying and hoping that this day is a great day for our church, and, more importantly, a day of ascribing great glory to God.

Here's the plan: we're going to talk about Friends Day most Sundays between now (6/8/25) and Friends Day (7/27/25).

There will be a build up to it. An escalation.

First, we'll think and pray. We'll spend two weeks identifying those to whom the Lord would direct us. We want to invite people who aren't Christians or people who are Christians, but aren't attending a church right now, or people who are Christians and are attending a church, but just not a healthy, biblical church. We can start this step today.

Start praying today about who God might have you reach out to. Write their name down. Ask for an opportunity. And trust Him to open the door.

After we have people in mind, we'll strike up conversations. Rather through phone calls, text messages, social media, or house visits, we'll reach out to catch up and/or to get to know one another better, with no mention just yet of Friends Day. At this point, we're just trying to establish a relationship and a rapport.

And for a couple of weeks, we'll try to develop the relationship. In the here and there conversation and the consistent check-ins, the aim would be to make the person

plenty aware that you're a Christian, that you love Jesus, and that Church is a vital component of your life. But still, no mention yet of Friends Day.

And with time, we'll eventually get to inviting them to our Friends Day celebration.

"Listen," you might say,

"We have this thing coming up at Church—we're calling it Friends Day."

"As you know, Church is a big part of my life. My Church has become my family, and they help me keep my eyes on what matters most: Jesus."

"When our pastor announced Friends Day, I immediately thought of you. I think you'd enjoy it—and it'd mean a lot to me if you came. It's on Sunday, July 27th. What do you say?"

Here's the point in all of this –

We want people to come to church and to hear the Gospel—because it's through the Gospel that God saves.

We want you to feel comfortable talking with people about Jesus. This, in reality, is a deliberate step-by-step lesson in evangelism and discipleship. We're modeling how to engage our friends and family in Gospel conversation, one step at a time.

I really do believe this is going to be a big day for our church.

So, let's pray –

Ask God to bless our efforts to bless him.

Ask God to send people our way that are ripe and ready for the Gospel.

Ask God to give you boldness, love, and wisdom in every conversation you have between now and then.

Let's trust him to do more than we can ask or imagine.

Hi Friends,

Summer moves fast, and so do I, but I truly love this season. I love the relationships I get to invest in, the memories we make, and the growth I see happening in our students right before my eyes.

But even in the middle of all the excitement, it's easy to forget to keep the main thing the main thing.

There's a trend going around on social media—maybe you've seen it. It features the phrase, "I forgot this was the whole point," followed by short, peaceful clips of people slowing down. For me, it's been a powerful reminder: pause, breathe, and re-center on what matters most—my relationship with God.

So today, I want to encourage both you and myself to intentionally slow down and stay focused on Him this summer. Here are a few practical ways to help you do just that:

1. Pick a Book of the Bible to Read Through

Our middle and high school students are reading through Psalms during Sunday School. I've encouraged them to read a Psalm or two each day. Join us—or choose another book to explore this summer!

2. Schedule Daily Quiet Time

Set aside intentional time each day for prayer, journaling, and reading scripture. It doesn't have to be long—but consistency will help anchor your day.

3. Limit Distractions

Create some "screen-free" time each day. Use it to take a walk, call a friend, play a game with your family, or dive into a good book. Even a small break from screens can help us feel more present and connected.

4. Serve God in Simple Ways

Look for new opportunities to serve. A few ideas:

- Help clean the church when Bob isn't scheduled
- Make and deliver meals to those who are sick
- Volunteer at a local food pantry
- Mow a neighbor's lawn
- Offer free babysitting to young families

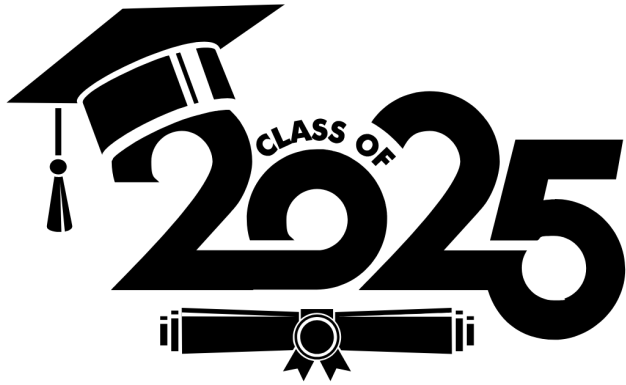

Mallory Estrada

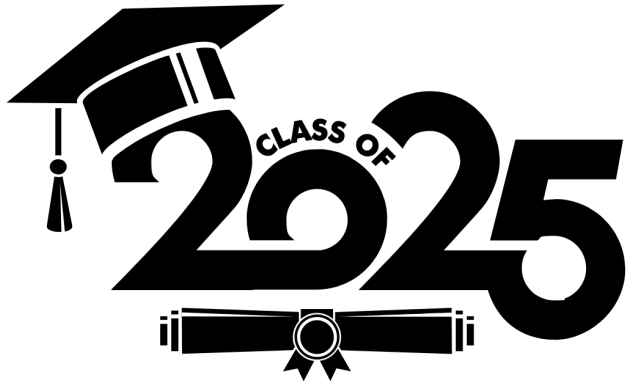

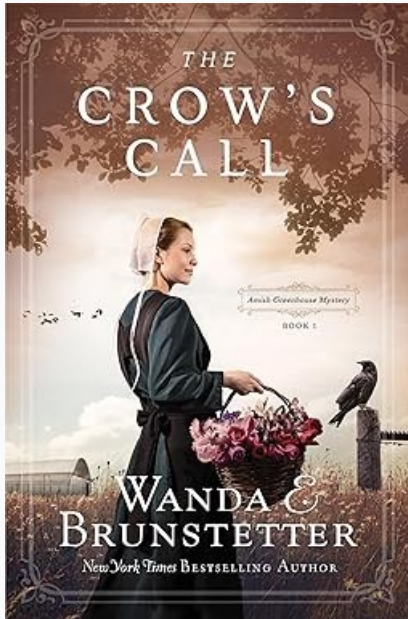
