During the month of December we will be collecting a special offering for the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering.

Lottie Moon was sent as a Southern Baptist missionary to China from 1873 to 1912. She saw firsthand the world's greatest problem — LOSTNESS. Meeting so many people who had never heard the gospel compelled her to write letters to American churches describing the need for a greater missionary presence.

She pleaded for increased prayer and financial support to send and sustain more missionaries. This challenge became known as the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering®.

From My Heart,

Almost 2,000 years ago, the angels appeared over the portals of heaven in expectancy. The plan of God through the ages was beginning to unfold. It would be only moments before they announced to the shepherds,

"For unto you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be the sign unto you, ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger." (Luke 2:11-12)

In the fullness of the time, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, lying in a manager. Unable to contain heaven's joy any longer, the angels would explode with jubilation, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace, good will toward men."

On Dec 3rd, we'll begin the countdown to Christmas known as Advent. During this season, may we be reminded, in the midst of all our busyness...the shopping, parties and decorating...the programs to attend, presents to buy and cookies to bake...it can be easy to forget to reflect on the true reason for the season - the Birth of long-awaited Messiah – Jesus Christ!

The four weeks before Christmas are a great time to slow down and begin to ponder the true meaning of this joyous season. As we spend time with family decorating our homes with garland and trimming our trees with ornaments & lights...may we take some deliberate steps to infuse our lives with hope, peace, love and joy in order to better celebrate and live out the truth of this season. For the beauty of Christmas is not found in the presents underneath your tree, but in His Presence in our everyday lives!!

I'll be sharing a series of messages entitled 'Christmas through the Eyes of Isaiah'. To truly grasp the essence of Christmas, let's experience Christmas through the eyes of the **prophet Isaiah**, who lived about **700 years before Christ**. His perspective sheds light on the profound significance of this season.

In Isaiah's time, the world was in turmoil. The mighty Assyrian empire threatened Israel and Judah, casting a shadow of darkness. Despite this impending danger, God's chosen people turned away from Him, relying on unholy alliances and their own strength. Isaiah warned them, but they remained unyielding. Consequently, they faced exile.

From that very exile, God promised a new salvation—a fresh exodus. Here is where Christmas enters the scene: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given…" (Isaiah 9:6). This child, our Messiah, would bring hope, comfort, and lasting peace. His government would know no end, and His reign would be just and righteous.

Isaiah's story extended beyond the manger to the cross, where Christ's sacrifice would transform lives. So, let's celebrate Christmas not merely as merely a sentimental holiday, but as the fulfillment of God's Grand Plan - a plan that began with a baby born in a manger would culminate in a Risen Savior who defeated SIN, DEATH and the GRAVE — which provides eternal hope for us all.

So, you can be prepared to rejoice this Advent Season – here are the verses for each week. **Week 1** – Hope – Isaiah 9:6-7; **Week 2** – Peace – Isaiah 28:16; **Week 3** – Love – Isaiah 53:4-6 and **Week 4** – Joy – Isaiah 61:1-3.

As we gather each week for worship, my prayer is for the Lord to enrich our fellowship, expand our influence, and enlarge the fields of harvest...all to HIS GLORY!!
